Danièle Sauvageau is known for her extensive experience in investigation, public safety, high level sport, business and sport & executive coaching. She has more than 33 years of service in policing where she has held strategic investigative and development senior positions. She has participated in 9 Olympic Games both winter and summer Games (2002 Gold medalist for women's hockey), several Pan American Games and World Championships as head coach, general manager, and mentor. Her unique career in policing and high performance sport led her to create Danièle Sauvageau Communications Inc. in 2002. She is currently the CEO of the Centre 21.02 Hight Performance Hockey and an associate professor at HEC Montréal.

Danièle has delivered several hundred mandates in the areas of governance, coaching in business, sports coaching, as well as harassment and conflict management in an organizational environment. She was one of the five member panel (2003-2005) for the federal government in the sports review process, which led to the creation of "Own the Podium". She was also the co- chair (2008) of the Provincial Advisory Committee Against Junior Hockey Violence (LHLMQ / appointed by the Ministry of Education), co-chair (2006) of the National Coaching Review (federal mandate), Chair USport Technical Sport committee since 2015 and recently appointed as a member of the CHL review panel. Danièle is a speaker at major conferences in Canada and Europe on subjects affecting both sport and business and teaches at Institute du Leadership du Québec.

First woman to coach in the Quebec Junior Major Hockey league with the Montreal Rocket. First woman to work as a hockey analyst for Radio Canada. Founder (2009) of the Université de Montréal Hockey Program Carabins' first women's hockey team.

She was (2013-17) President and Chief Executive Officer of the "Montreal Police & Fire Games 2017" event. (12,000 participants / 62 sports).

Danièle is a graduate in social work from Université de Montréal, the Royal Canadian Mountain Police Academy and the School of Higher Commercial Studies (HEC). As a coach and master coach/mentor, Danièle has obtained the highest level in Canada and in France.

She was a member of the Vancouver 2010 Games Nominating board member and is currently a member of several boards including president of Conseil du Sport de Montreal, and Swimming Canada.

In 2012, Danièle was made an Officer of the Order of Canada for her exceptional contribution to Canadian and international sport.
